CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE, MOMENT OF SILENCE

Chairman Ott called the regular meeting of April 7th 2010 to order at 2:00 p.m. in the Circuit Courtroom of the New Courts Building in Palmyra, Virginia and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited along with a moment of silence.

REPORTS

Mr. James Glass, VDOT Residency Administrator, introduced Mr. Jim Utterback, Culpeper District Administrator, who proceeded to provide a status update of VDOT closings, departmental changes, and snow removal. Mr. Utterback summarized the facilities that are impacted with the closings: the residency in Culpeper is closing which covers Madison, Orange and Culpeper; the Louisa Residency which covers Louisa and Fluvanna; the shop in Louisa is closing along with the shop in Orange which services the Culpeper residency. The residency in Charlottesville will cover Fluvanna County and will be focused exclusively on maintenance activity.

Supervisor Chesser requested an update on the Turkeysag Trail project. Mr. Glass provided some information and indicated he would obtain additional information and provide it to the Board.

Mrs. Shelly H. Wright, Interim County Administrator, reported on the following topics:

1. The Citizen Water Committee has begun to meet and has developed objectives for evaluating water system alternatives and has begun to look at previously explored routing alternatives. A webpage has been created that is devoted to the work of this committee and all of the information that is provided to this committee is available there. We are also finalizing ways to involve citizens through signing up to be notified of new information out of this Committee through e-mail and regular mail.
2. The appropriations requests to the House and Senate for public safety radio funding have been put forward. Congressman Perriello introduced \$350,000 on the House side, and Senators Warner and Webb introduced \$500,000 on the Senate side.
3. There have been some questions about the status of CIP funding. The advertised budget had no funding for any capital projects in FY11. In order to keep those projects in the plan, those projects were moved to FY12. Additionally, based on Board discussion, the CIP has no funding for the Domino Plan.
4. The staff is following up on the issue that was raised at a recent Board meeting regarding the use of brick or clapboard for the comfort station on Pleasant Grove as a part of the Western Trailhead Project. Dwight Godwin is working on pulling together all of the information on that issue and will be bringing that to the Board in May.

Rivanna Conservation Society Stormwater Report for Fluvanna County

Ms. Robbi Savage, RCS Executive Director, along with Lance Broomhall and Leon Szeptycki provided a PowerPoint presentation regarding stormwater evaluations and analyses. The report highlighted several areas that are planned for review including parking and landscaping sections of the zoning ordinance, along with several other recommendations that staff feels are feasible such as strengthening the local erosion and sediment control regulations.

Authorization to Submit a USDA Farmers Market Promotion Grant Application

This grant requires no County match. This program is intended to encourage the development, promotion and expansion of direct marketing of agricultural commodities from farmers to consumers. This grant program offers an opportunity for the County to assist Fluvanna Farmers Market vendors to improve their businesses, increase sales and further promote the Fluvanna First – work, shop, play promotion.

Mr. John Thompson, Extension Agent, addressed the Board regarding this issue.

Mr. Gooch moved that the Board of Supervisors authorize submission of a grant application to the USDA under the Farmers Market and Local Food Marketing program for up to \$100,000 to design and plan a farmers market structure, develop a web page, conduct a marketing study, design a brand campaign and offer workshops for vendors; and if awarded, further authorize a supplemental appropriation of the amount awarded and authorize the County Administrator to execute all agreements and contracts associated with this grant, subject to approval as to form by the County Attorney. RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE, SALE AND AWARD OF \$40,000 REVENUE ANTICIPATION NOTE OF THE FORK UNION SANITARY DISTRICT AND PROVIDING FOR THE FORM, DETAILS AND PAYMENT THEREOF

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of Fluvanna County, Virginia (the "County"), as the governing body of the Fork Union Sanitary District (the "District") has determined to obtain short-term financing to meet casual deficits in the revenue of the District, in anticipation of the collection of the revenue of the District, in accordance with Virginia Code Section 21.1-118.4; and

WHEREAS, the County, on February 3, 2010, approved providing such short-term financing, in the principal amount of \$40,000; and

WHEREAS, the amount of such short-term financing does not exceed one-half of the amount reasonably anticipated to be produced by the revenues of the District, including taxes levied pursuant to Virginia Code Section 21-119, for the 2010 calendar year, exclusive of any anticipated tax revenues of the district which have not actually been levied and assessed against property within the District; and

WHEREAS, the Board, as the governing body of the District, has determined to authorize such short-term financing pursuant to the Revenue Anticipation Note (the "Note"), to be dated April 7, 2010, to be issued by the District to the County; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF FLUVANNA COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. Sale of the Note. The Board, acting as the governing body of the District, hereby authorizes the District to borrow and repay the principal sum of \$40,000.00 in order to meet casual deficits in the revenue of the District expected to occur prior to the collection of taxes and revenues. Such debt shall be evidenced by a certain Note to be issued to the County in accordance with the terms of this Resolution.

2. Note Details; Payment Provisions. The Note shall be issued as a single fully registered note which shall be designated "Revenue Anticipation Note, Series of 2010" (the "Note"), shall be in typewritten form, shall be in the principal amount of \$40,000.00, shall be numbered R-1, shall be dated April 7, 2010, shall mature on December 15, 2010, and shall bear no interest. The Note shall be issued

pursuant to the Constitution of Virginia, the statutes of the Commonwealth of Virginia and a resolution adopted by the County's Board of Supervisors on April 7, 2010.

3. Prepayment of Note. The Note shall be subject to prepayment prior to maturity at the option of the District in whole or in part at any time without premium, upon payment of the outstanding principal amount to be prepaid.

4. Execution of Note. The Note shall be signed on behalf of the District by the manual signature of the Chairman of the Board, countersigned by the manual signature of the Clerk of the Board and the Board's seal shall be affixed thereto.

5. Note Form. The Note shall be in substantially the form of Exhibit A, which is attached hereto, with such completions, omissions, insertions and changes not inconsistent with this Resolution as may be approved by the officers signing the Note, whose approval shall be evidenced conclusively by the execution and delivery of the Note.

6. Registration and Transfer of Note. The Note shall be issued in registered form without coupons, payable to the registered holder or registered assigns. The County Treasurer is hereby appointed paying agent and registrar for the Note (the "Registrar"). The County may appoint a qualified bank or trust company as successor Registrar. The Registrar shall maintain registration books for the registration and registration of transfer of the Note. The Note may be transferred only upon an assignment executed by the registered holder in such form as shall be satisfactory to the Registrar, such transfer to be made on the registration books and endorsed on the Note by the Registrar. The person or persons in whose name or names the Note shall be registered shall be deemed and regarded as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes, and payment of the principal of the Note shall be made only to or upon the order of the registered owner thereof or his legal representative.

7. Preparation and Delivery of Notes. The Chairman and the Clerk of the Board are authorized and directed to take all proper steps to have the Note prepared and executed, to comply with provisions of this Resolution and to deliver the Note to the County Treasurer who shall deliver the Note to the County upon payment by the County of the principal amount thereof.

9. Other Actions. All other actions of officers of the County, the District and the Board in conformity with the purposes and intent of this Resolution and in furtherance of the issuance and sale of the Note are hereby ratified, approved and confirmed. The officers of the County and the District are authorized and directed to execute and deliver all certificates and instruments and to take all action necessary or desirable in connection with the issuance, sale and delivery of the Note.

10. Repeal of Conflicting Resolutions. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

11. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

National Telecommunications Week

April 11 -- 17, 2010

Whereas emergencies can occur at anytime that require law enforcement, fire or emergency medical services;

And Whereas when an emergency occurs the prompt response of law enforcement, firefighters and medical rescue is critical to the protection of life and preservation of property;

And Whereas the safety of our law enforcement, firefighters and medical rescue is dependent upon the quality and accuracy of information obtained from citizens who telephone the Fluvanna County Communications Center;

And Whereas Public Safety Dispatchers are the first and most critical contact our citizens have with emergency services;

And Whereas Public Safety Dispatchers are the single vital link for our law enforcement, firefighters and medical rescue by monitoring their activities by radio, providing them information and insuring their safety;

And Whereas Public Safety Dispatchers of the Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office have contributed substantially to the apprehension of criminals, suppression of fires and treatment of patients;

And Whereas each dispatcher has exhibited compassion, understanding and professionalism during the performance of their job in the past year;
