### REPORTS

- Membership update
  - Stephanie states that FPA is now complete as a committee, as well as indicating that anyone in the community is welcome to attend meetings
- Jennifer McDaniel (DHHSC) will present at the next meeting
- MOW presentation—Joe Chesser
  - 360 meals per week to 72 clients; meals cost \$5 from Dogwood and MOW charges \$5.50 accordingly to cover materials costs; clients are charged on a sliding scale—most are at no-charge
  - 6 routes ~ 200 miles per day with another to be developed for Kent Store
  - 14 volunteers necessary per diem, including those who package meals, drivers, etc.
  - Kitchen at Effort Baptist; food provided through Dogwood; pet food also given (SPCA and others)

- no government funding; all by grants, donations and fundraising; most dire need
  - \$100K per annum
- George Gorman (also MOW Board member)—Weekend MOW
  - recognized the need for seven-days-a-week service
  - Lisa Himes sought funds; Bonnie Nicks now coordinating through UMC
  - first and third Wednesdays, volunteers meet at church; non-perishable items through EW Thomas; volunteers pack meal bags in totes—4 per client to cover 2 weekends; positive notes also included
  - on weekends, driver plus passenger deliver packages at no-charge
  - emergency kits also available
  - physically and socially beneficial
- Mozell H. Booker reports that meals available through MOMS (JABA program) via FedEx
- Parks and Rec report from Jonathan Pace via Stephanie
  - Kent Store facility moving from ARC Building to Beulah Church
  - 15-20 members at Cunningham, 20-25 at Fork Union, 5 at Kent Store (which puts the Kent Store program at risk)
- DSS—cooling assistance starts 15 June through August 15; available by application, which is done on a yearly basis; income based
