PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

I pledge allegiance, to the flag, of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

GENERAL RULES OF ORDER

- 1. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to maintain order and decorum at meetings. The Chairman shall speak to points of order in preference to all other members.
- 2. In maintaining decorum and propriety of conduct, the Chairman shall not be challenged and no debate shall be allowed until after the Chairman declares that order has been restored. In the event the Board wishes to debate the matter of the disorder or the bringing of order; the regular business may be suspended by vote of the Board to discuss the matter.
- 3. No member or citizen shall be allowed to use defamatory or abusive language directed at any member of the Board or other person, to create excessive noise, or in any way incite persons to use such tactics. The Chair shall be the judge of such breaches, however, the Board may by majority vote of the Board members present and voting to overrule the judgment of the Chair.
- 4. When a person engages in such breaches, the Chairman shall order the person's removal from the building, or may order the person to stand silent, or may, if necessary, order the person removed from the County property.

RULES OF PROCEDURE FOR PUBLIC HEARINGS

1. PURPOSE

- The purpose of a public hearing is to receive testimony from the public on certain resolutions, ordinances or amendments prior to taking action.
- A hearing is not a dialogue or debate. Its express purpose is to receive additional facts, comments and opinion on subject items.

2. SPEAKERS

- Speakers should approach the lectern so they may be visible and audible to the Board.
- Each speaker should clearly state his/her name and address.
- All comments should be directed to the Board.
- All questions should be directed to the Chairman. Members of the Board are not expected to respond to questions, and response to questions shall be made at the Chairman's discretion.
- Speakers are encouraged to contact staff regarding unresolved concerns or to receive additional information.
- Speakers with questions are encouraged to call County staff prior to the public hearing.
- Speakers should be brief and avoid repetition of previously presented comments.

3. ACTION

- At the conclusion of the public hearing on each item, the Chairman will close the public hearing.
- The Board will proceed with its deliberation and will act on or formally postpone action on such item prior to proceeding to other agenda items.
- Further public comment after the public hearing has been closed generally will not be permitted.

Total federal funding is \$208,432 which includes the annual U.S. SBA commitment that must be matched by the municipalities, the Fork Union U.S. SBA Portable Assistance grant and CV SBDC's bonus for exceeding goals. Virginia funding is \$55,000 from the GO Virginia grant that pays for rural outreach. Projected additional core operating funds include local municipal total of \$239,329, fees for limited events estimated at \$2,500, and fundraising/gifts/bequests estimated at \$80,000. At \$585,261 in projected revenue we anticipate a gap of \$20,794.

Section 5 - IMPACT IF NOT FUNDED BY FLUVANNA COUNTY (Briefly explain the impact on each program area if not funded by Fluvanna County.)

County visits and specialty business training programs would likely cease. CV SBDC would prioritize serving clients virtually. Wait times for service may increase given the consistently high volume of requests for service from Fluvanna County. The ultimate impact is that business owners would not receive qualified, professional support when needed. This lack of accessible assistance can lead to business failure and unneccesary challenges limiting business success; and thus, job creation and expanded taxable income for the County. Failing businesses also remove community services and economic diversity, resulting in less livable communities and exporting of revenue and talent.

The Central Virginia Small Business Development Center (CV SBDC) supports small businesses in our region with free of charge: 1) confidential 1:1 business and technical support, 2) webinars and seminars on business topics, 3) industry-specific market and financial research, 4) relevant business connections, 5) a twice monthly newsletter detailing information business owners need to know and access to financial and management information, and 6) an over 40 page website linking to tools and resources for business success. Details regarding service in Fluvanna County for 2023/24 were provided in the Fluvanna County Board of Supervisors presentation, given in November 2024. This included consulting service to 57 entrepreneurs who employ 97 people.

Section 3 - DESCRIPTION AND JUSTIFICATION OF FUNDING NEEDS (Briefly describe how the funding would be used. Bullets preferred.)

Funding will support Fluvanna County kids, families and early childhood educators, to experience high quality early learning education and positive, nurturing and healthy family relationships. Specifically, funding will be used to help Fluvanna early childhood educators improve the quality of their services - particularly to low-income families; and provide intensive masters-level counseling for victims of child abuse, neglect, exposure to domestic violence and/or trauma survivors, and their non-abusing family members at no cost. Last year, ReadyKids directly served 91 Fluvanna County residents, including 66 through counseling and 20 kids in Fluvanna's HeadStart classroom. In FY24, 94.5% of all ReadyKids program participants met targeted outcomes, including; 100% of Ready Kids experienced improved quality early care and education; 99% were safe from abuse and neglect; and 86% of ReadyKids were better prepared to begin school. ReadyKids respectfully requests an increase of 13%, to cover the increased cost of providing services in Fluvanna, including but not limited to: staff training, materials, transportation, and salary.

ReadyKids is committed to serving children and families in Fluvanna County, and continues to actively pursue diverse funding streams for our programs so that they remain stable even during times of great economic uncertainity. Our Counseling Program experienced significant state funding cuts last year which reduced our capacity across the service area, including in Fluvanna County. Without funds from Fluvanna County, we could have further reductions in our capacity, negatively impacting Fluvanna residents. The County's demonstration of its support for our work there and recognition of its value is important to us.

Fluvanna County Success Story: Mariel Lewis, ReadyKids Infant-Toddler Specialist, worked closely with a child care provider in Fluvanna County to enhance the quality of care in this provider's classroom which serves up to 12 local infants and children. Through personalized coaching and ongoing support from Ms. Lewis, the provider successfully raised her CLASS (Classroom Assessment Scoring System) score by two points—a notable achievement, given that the Virginia Infant & Toddler Specialist Network considers any increase of 0.25 points significant. In recognition of her dedication to delivering high-quality care, Ms. Lewis nominated the provider for a Virginia Infant & Toddler Specialist Network award. The provider was selected for the award and received \$2,000 in materials and furniture to help further enhance her classroom and care.

ReadyKids is deeply grateful for our enduring partnership with Fluvanna County, which makes stories like this one possible and continues to drive meaningful impact for local child care providers, as well as the children and families they serve.

#1*JABA's Respite and Enrichment Center (REC - formerly Adult Care Center) provides daily supportive services for adults 18 and older who have dementia-related and/or physical disabilities requiring assistance with daily health or personal care needs, and need more supervision for safety. JRECs support members with a 1:6 staff-to-member ratio. Staff works with caregivers to provide respite physical care, such as showers, often difficult and takes away from the family relationship. RNs/LPNs provide assessment, care coordination, and medication management. C.N.A.s and registered medication aides provide hands-on support for JREC members.

#2* Social Isolation and Food Insecurity: The Senior Nutrition and Wellness Program provides onsite and virtual services addressing the individual quality of life in the areas of nutrition, health, activities, and socialization. Community Centers offer nutritious meals prepared and provided by JABA's chef with menus approved by a registered dietician (RDN) ensuring they meet daily nutritional standards set for older adults. RDNs and a Health Educator provide nutritional education materials and counseling. Activities provided by JABA staff and volunteers include bingo, trivia, informational presentations, health education, and exercise. Staff also seeks opportunities for field trips to enhance socialization and reduce isolation. This year, JABA opened a new community center in Fluvanna focusing on socialization, nutrition, and healthy aging and it has been well attended. Additionally, JABA offers home-bound individuals fresh, RDN-approved meals selected from a menu and delivered to their residences. The HDM program also includes social support by volunteers with virtual activities.

#3*Community Resource Services consist of Information and Assistance (IA), Aging Service Coordination (ASC), Medicare Insurance Counseling and Long-Term Care Ombudsman. These services support individuals and families in making informed decisions by identifying their needs and translating this information into a plan of care. Straight-forward requests are handled by IA; individuals with complex needs are referred to an ASC for person-centered counseling to identify and assist with accessing community resources. ASCs are certified by the state and complete annual professional training.

*Insurance counseling staff & and volunteers receive in-depth training on Medicare and complete 20 hours of shadowing with an experienced counselor, providing unbiased counseling, unassociated with any insurance company, certified by the state to provide services. Over 50% of individuals counseled save money on plan costs, prescriptions, and co-payments. This service is available to all Medicare recipients and benefits individuals and their employers.

* Ombudsmen educate people on their rights and mediate complaints in long-term care settings. *Each JABA program follows stringent standards put in place by the Dept. of Aging and Rehabilitative Services, the Dept. of Social Services, and the Dept. of Health. JABA incorporates a variety of best practices as outlined by our professional associations, such as the US Aging, Natl Council on Aging, and Leading Age.

In 2024, JABA served 1,334 Fluvanna County residents. People 65+ comprised 21% of the population in 2020. By 2030 this will almost increase to 25.3% of county residents. Our most vulnerable group, those 85+ will increase at a faster rate, 70% by 2040. We know 28.9% of Fluvanna seniors live alone, many with a limited income, with fewer personal supports in place. Non-funding would affect the lower-income older population in Fluvanna County by:

resulting in increased depression, stress, fear and loneliness.

- *Loss of a familiar, convenient entry point into aging and disability services networks.
- *Increased time and frustration involved in finding services and supports to meet their needs.
- *Increased demand for county services around aging issues.

(continued from section 5)*Decreased awareness of resources and services to assist individuals and families with their aging issues and questions.

- *Reduced availability of staff who provide intensive support and coordination of multiple services.
- *Fewer meals available to those who need it.

- *Less ready access to medical care.

Non-funding would affect family caregivers by:

- *Putting their own health at risk as many caregivers are elderly themselves.

- *Decreasing access to eldercare resources they need, thus reducing not only their quality of life but also that of the seniors in their care.

- •Bousing & Consumer Justice helps people remain stably housed and removes barriers to financial stability by defending people against eviction and debt collection.
- •Bealth & Benefits helps people avoid high medical bills and access or reinstate health benefits and income supports such as Medicaid, SSI/SSDI, and SNAP.
- Morker Justice helps residents recover stolen wages, including unpaid overtime, and fights discriminatory employment practices.
- •Mouth Justice helps students receive the services they need including accessing special education services and mental health supports. We help our constituents use the legal system and various administrative processes (e.g., school system, local department of social services) to assert their rights. We provide a full range of legal services, including the dissemination of legal information, legal advice, and full representation in court or administrative proceedings.

We also allocate a portion of our state funding through the Legal Services Corporation of Virginia and a portion of our unrestricted donations from individuals and law firms to support the services we provide to Fluvanna County.

LAJC serves low-income residents and families throughout Virginia. We are committed to providing services to the residents of Fluvanna County, and they will continue at some level regardless of the outcome of this application. However, County funding for our services is integral to our ability to remain flexible and responsive to changes in the environment in which we provide our services. A loss of funding would hurt our ability to respond to new community challenges and we would have to prioritize our commitment to existing clients and cases. Funding from the County preserves our ability to meet community needs as they arise.

In FY24, we worked 16 cases for Fluvanna residents representing 54 people. 9 of those cases have been resolved and 7 are on-going. The closed cases generated \$99,765 in direct economic benefits for our clients and their families. The open cases include 2 eviction defense cases where we have already delayed eviction of our clients and will hopefully avoid it all together.

This year, we anticipate providing services to 20 Fluvanna households.

Section 5 - IMPACT IF NOT FUNDED BY FLUVANNA COUNTY (Briefly explain the impact on each program area if not funded by Fluvanna County.)

Fluvanna County's contribution to the District is returned many times over through our success in acquiring funding from other sources such as agricultural cost-share funds and other grants. This funding cannot be utilized effectively without adequate staff to administer and implement these conservation programs. This funding would not be available without local matching contributions. For FY25, we received record amounts of state cost-share funding to implement agricultural and residential best management practices throughout our SWCD. It is projected that we will continue to receive a high level of funding through FY26. We need sufficient resources to maintain a trained and professional staff to provide landowners with technical and financial assistance. If unfunded or underfunded, we will continue to prioritize our staff resources to best support the services and localities from which we have adequate funding. It should be noted that every locality in Virginia is responsible for a portion of the required improvements to the Chesapeake Bay. With our ability to leverage funds, and with our long-standing technical capabilities, our services are likely the most cost-effective way to achieve these goals on the local level.

Section 6 - ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Agricultural and residential conservation work reduces pollution in runoff flowing to local waterways and, ultimately, to the Chesapeake Bay. Detailed information for all of the services of the TJSWCD and their benefits are described on the "TJSWCD Programs" tab/sheet in this packet. Quantitative summaries of accomplishments from 1998 through FY24 have been included with this budget request. The TJSWCD has been, and will continue to be, a resource for information, technical assistance, and support to citizens, local staff, and public officials regarding the Chesapeake Bay initiatives and other water quality concerns.

TJSWCD Program Descriptions

The TJSWCD provides **Conservation Leadership**, serving as a focal point for, and providing coordination to, governmental and nongovernmental organizations involved in water quality issues. Members of the District represent our localities on many local and state steering committees, technical advisory committees, and other community natural resource groups, providing technical expertise and guidance. We work in partnership with local, state, and federal natural resource-related organizations, providing coordination, communication, and cost-efficiencies that the individual organizations alone would not achieve. District representatives serve on DCR's BMP Technical Advisory Committee and the Virginia Association of SWCDs Steering Committee for the Virginia Conservation Assistance Program (see https://vaswcd.org/vcap for more information on VCAP). Ten Directors of the TJSWCD Board are elected (two from each locality) and two additional Directors are appointed (one at large and one from the Extension office). Directors serve (without pay) as liaisons between local citizens and local, state, and federal officials. The at-large Director position is held by a Fluvanna resident. The Extension Director position is held by the Fluvanna Extension Agent.

The TJSWCD is the primary source of natural resource-related Educational Services in this area. Local officials, schools, community organizations, and the general public are able to utilize TJSWCD for workshops, "field days," presentations, school events, and technical information. Classroom presentations and teacher workshops support grade-specific Standards of Learning. The District coordinates the National Envirothon Program locally (a nationwide, team-based environmental competition). Each year, the TJSWCD provides funding to send two students to a weeklong Youth Conservation Camp held at VA Tech. The TJSWCD also provides an annual scholarship for individuals wanting to pursue a degree in a natural resource-related field. In addition to online resources, TJSWCD education staff are available for live and/or virtual demonstrations that focus on watersheds, water quality, and how we all can do better to protect and conserve our natural resources. The TJSWCD created a document containing links to educational resources and printable materials that was emailed to 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade teachers to be utilized in their classrooms, potentially reaching 698 students.

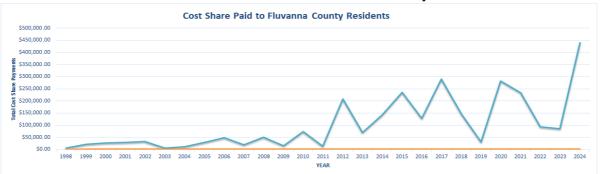
Agricultural Programs of the TJSWCD provide financial and technical assistance to the agricultural community. Services include technical assistance to landowners for farm planning and the design and installation of agricultural best management practices (BMPs); financial assistance to landowners for the installation of BMPs; local implementation of the Virginia Agricultural Stewardship Act; and general conservation planning assistance. Historically, the District's agricultural programs focused on traditional "production farming." However, the program has kept pace with changing times to serve smaller "farmettes" and large "estate farms." Since 1998, the TJSWCD provided cost share dollars and tax credits of over \$2.8 million directly to Fluvanna County farmers. In addition, landowners in Fluvanna contributed an additional match of over \$673,000 of their own funds. An upward trend for FY26 in conservation work is expected to continue as the Chesapeake Bay Cleanup Program puts increased emphasis on incentive-based programs to help localities meet necessary pollution reductions. For FY25, as of October 2024, we already have \$1 million of approved active projects in Fluvanna County. Since many projects are required to be maintained for ten years, TJSWCD staff will continue to monitor and spot-check those projects to ensure the water quality goals are being met (see https://www.dcr.virginia.gov/soil-and-water/ for more information).

Residential/Suburban/Urban Services provide support and technical assistance to the non-agricultural community and to local staffs and public officials. Services include: technical assistance to the community for the design and installation of "low impact development" practices (such as rainwater harvesting, rain gardens, and riparian buffers); and technical assistance to developers to help them meet local, state, and federal environmental requirements. The TJSWCD led a statewide effort to acquire funding for a cost-share program to support conservation on non-agricultural lands. This has now become a popular Baywide program in Virginia. The TJSWCD also acquired funding to provide homeowners with financial assistance to repair or replace failing septic systems. The District continues to provide each locality with the specific services it requests to address issues related to water quality and quantity in the built environment. These programs will take on added urgency as the Chesapeake Bay Cleanup initiative will put more emphasis on local administration of these programs. The TJSWCD is positioned to provide the support, information, and technical assistance that is needed in each locality.

The TJSWCD Easement Program was developed to provide a means for protecting land areas that contribute to the improvement and protection of water quality. Other easement programs protect land for historic, recreational, or aesthetic purposes, and usually are limited to larger acreages. The TJSWCD program focuses on the acquisition of riparian easements, which protect in perpetuity forest buffers along streams. Many of these easements are granted by developers who utilize it as a cost-effective way to mitigate the water-related impacts of development, and help meet stormwater management requirements. Others are donated voluntarily by landowners wishing to protect the integrity of their streamside areas. The costs of any Easement Program are twofold: (1) short-term costs of providing information and negotiating easements, and (2) long-term costs of custodial responsibilities (monitoring, enforcement). Funds requested from member localities are used to offset the short-term costs. In order to ensure that program resources will be available to meet the long-term responsibilities of holding perpetual easements in perpetuity, the TJSWCD formed a subsidiary 501c3 Foundation (Thomas Jefferson Water Resources Protection Foundation) to administer funds for the long-term costs. The Foundation accepts fees and contributions to ensure that funds will be available to cover the long-term responsibilities. Our most recent easement was placed on a Fluvanna County development (Houchens Place - Habitat for Humanity housing) that utilized our easement program to help meet their stormwater management requirements. The District now holds and monitors five easements on 389 acres and includes the protection of 6,010 feet of forested stream buffers in Fluvanna.

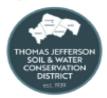

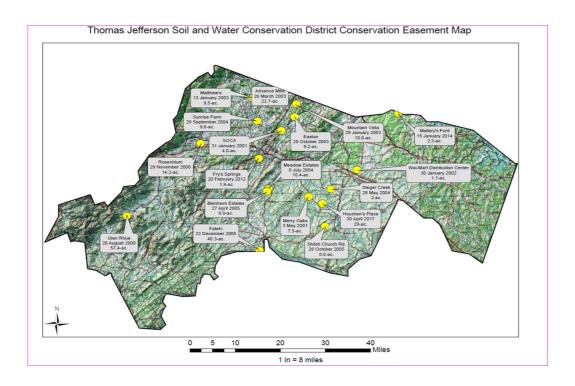

TERM CONTRACT BETWEEN COUNTY AND ARCHITECT/ENGINEER FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

This Term Contract Between COUNTY and Architect/Engineer for Professional Services (the "Contract") dated this _____ day of January, 2025 is between the **COUNTY OF FLUVANNA** (the "COUNTY"), a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Virginia and **Enteros Design, P.C.** ("Enteros" or "A/E"), a Virginia professional corporation authorized to transact business in Virginia, and is binding among and between these parties as of the date of the COUNTY's signature.

RECITALS:

1. The legal address for the COUNTY and for the A/E and the addresses for delivery of Notices and other documents related to the administration of this Contract are as follows:

2. On October 9, 2024 the COUNTY issued Request for Proposals #2024-11 (the "RFP") for professional architectural & engineering services for four separate projects relating to the design and construction services of two new Government Buildings and the renovation of two existing Government Buildings, as more specifically set out in such RFP attached hereto as Exhibit 1, which is incorporated herein as a material part of this Contract. The original proposal submittal by the A/E to the RFP dated November 8, 2024 (the "Proposal") is attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and is incorporated herein as a material part of this Contract. All the provisions and requirements, including, but not limited to, the purpose and scope, of the RFP and the Proposal are incorporated herein by reference. Project Agreement Task orders shall be issued by the COUNTY to the A/E, and may include civil engineering and design, architectural design, site planning, construction phase services, inspection services, and associated surveying, environmental, geotechnical and architectural services or other matters set forth in the RFP. The purposes, functions, criteria and general requirements for the scope of work on a task order or particular project will be set forth in a Project Agreement executed by the COUNTY and the A/E.

- 3. The rights and duties of the COUNTY and Enteros applicable to the COUNTY's projects under this Contract are set forth in the following Contract Documents: (i) this Contract including all Project Agreements executed under this Contract; (ii) the RFP and all of the terms of the County of Fluvanna General Terms Conditions and Instructions to Bidders and Contractors, being pages 9 to 34 of Exhibit 1 hereto; and (iii) the Proposal. In the event of any conflict between the terms of this Contract and any exhibit hereto, the following shall be the order of control in resolving such conflicts (i) controls over (ii) and (iii); and (ii) controls over (iii). Notwithstanding the foregoing, whenever possible the documents shall be read together.
- 4. One or more Project Agreements may be entered into with the A/E during the Contract Term. Although the potential exists for multiple projects during the Contract Term, the COUNTY does not represent or guarantee that the A/E will receive one or more Project Agreements during the Contract Term. The COUNTY has no obligation to enter into any Project Agreement(s) with the A/E.

THEREFORE, in consideration of the Recitals set forth above, and good and valuable consideration as set forth below, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Recitals: The Recitals are incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. <u>Scope of Services:</u> The A/E agrees that he is willing and able during the Contract term to provide the desired professional services during the Contract term. The work may include, but is not limited to, investigations, studies, reports, project designs, inspection services, and similar services as more specifically described in the RFP. The purposes, functions, criteria and general requirements for the scope of work on the task or particular project will be set forth in a project agreement issued to the A/E.
- 3. <u>Project Agreements; Limitation:</u> Individual projects will be negotiated at a lump sum amount or based on hourly rates as set forth in Exhibit 3, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The hourly rates set forth in Exhibit 3 shall control for all Project Agreements during the Term. Project Agreements shall be entered into for each individual project, specifying additional contract terms applicable to the individual project, including but not limited to the following: (i) detailed scope of work for the project; (ii) pricing of the project; (iii) billing schedule for the project (whether periodic or on completed project basis); (iv) timing requirements for project performance; and (v) identification of the COUNTY's project manager for the project, to whom invoices and other contacts regarding the specific project shall be directed.
- 4. <u>Contract Term:</u> This Contract shall be in effect from the date of signature by the COUNTY for a one (1) year period (the "Initial Term"). This Contract shall automatically renew thereafter for four (4) additional one (1) year terms unless the COUNTY notifies the A/E prior to the end of the current term that it does not intend to renew this Contract. The Term of the Contract is the Initial Term and all renewals thereof.
- 5. Exhibits and Resolving Conflicts

The rights and duties of the County and A/E applicable to the County's projects under this Contract are set forth in the following Contract Documents:

- i. This Contract;
- ii. Exhibit 1 hereto;
- iii. Exhibit 2 hereto, being the Proposal submitted by the A/E, dated November 8, 2024
- iv. Exhibit 3 hereto, being the hourly rates of the A/E

Whenever possible, the terms of the above Contract Documents shall be read together, however in the event of a conflict, the order of preference above shall govern which Document will control. In other words, (i) shall control over (ii) to (iv) above, and (ii) shall control over (iii) and (iv) and so forth.

6. Indemnification.

The following language shall supersede the language of paragraph 54 of the County's Terms and Conditions which were attached to Exhibit 1, being Request for Proposals #2024-11:

Contractor agrees to indemnify, keep and save harmless the County, its officers, agents, officials, employees and volunteers against any and all claims, claims of injuries, death, damage to property, patent claims, suits, liabilities, judgments, losses, costs and expenses, including but not limited to, all reasonable attorneys' fees arising out of the negligent acts, errors or omissions, recklessness or intentionally wrongful conduct of Contractor in performance of the Contract. Contractor expressly understands and agrees that any performance bond or insurance protection required by any Contract, or otherwise provided by the Contractor, shall in no way limit the responsibility to indemnify, keep and save harmless and defend the County as herein provided. Nothing contained in this Solicitation or the Contract shall be deemed to be a waiver of the County's sovereign immunity.

Enteros Design is pleased to present this proposal for a Space Study and Conceptual Evaluation of the County of Fluvanna government buildings identified in RFP #2024-11. This proposal incorporates the scope of services identified in the RFP for the Space Study and our recommendations for a conceptual evaluation needed to define the project parameters. The following proposal summarizes our project understanding, Scope of Services, and proposed fees.

The County has requested an update to the 2019 space study completed by Crabtree, Rohrbaugh & Associates to more accurately define the needs for the new County Administration building, new Social Services building, renovation of the existing Administration building, renovation of the existing Social Services building, potential expansion of the Sheriff's office, and improvements to access and security in the Courthouse. We anticipate the following Scope of Services for the study.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Programming

Conduct a kickoff meeting with County officials and key stakeholders

Gather any existing documents and information provided by the County

The departments listed in the RFP will be included in the programming effort

Develop a questionnaire to be completed by the department heads

Review the questionnaire and interview the department heads to define the space requirements

Develop a preliminary list of spaces, square footages, and requirements for each department

Prepare building programs for each department listing the spaces, square footage, and support facilities needed for each building.

Review the building program with County officials and department heads and revise based on comments received in the review meeting

Existing Conditions Assessment

Review existing documents and reports for each building and site
Visit each building and site to review existing conditions
Provide a written report summarizing the general condition of each building and site
Provide a summary of existing factors which could influence the building or site design

Prepare Conceptual Diagrams and Narratives

Prepare conceptual diagrams showing the location of each department and its size relative to new or existing buildings

Prepare diagrams showing the size and conceptual shape of each building on a site plan Show conceptual site improvements and parking

Provide conceptual design narratives summarizing the anticipated architectural, civil, structural, mechanical, electrical, and plumbing requirements for each building

We will use the services of Timmons Group, Dunbar, and Pace Collaborative for conceptual engineering evaluations. The proposals from these engineering firms are included in this proposal and their Scopes of Service are incorporated into this agreement.

We anticipate a total of 10 days of onsite meetings or site visits for this phase of the project. These visits will be used for programming meetings, existing conditions assessments, and presentations. Additional meetings can be arranged through Zoom as needed. We will rely on the County to efficiently schedule meetings with department heads to accommodate a maximum of 10 days of onsite meetings.

PROPOSED FEES

We have developed the enclosed fee schedule for review and consideration by the County. We have incorporated the services we feel are appropriate at this phase of the project, but we can adjust as needed to meet the County's needs. The services listed will provide the County with a good understanding of the project parameters, the size and scope of each building, and the potential costs. This study will form the basis for moving forward with full design and construction documents for the project.

For reimbursable expenses such as mileage, printing, shipping, etc. we will bill our cost plus 15%. We do not anticipate a significant amount of reimbursable expenses on this phase of the project.

ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE CODE OF THE COUNTY OF FLUVANNA, VIRGINIA", BY ENACTING §§ 20-13-1 THROUGH 20-13-13 TO AUTHORIZE THE TREASURER IN ACCORDANCE WITH VIRGINIA CODE SECTION 58.1-3833 TO COLLECT A TAX OF XX PERCENT ON PREPARED FOOD AND BEVERAGES SOLD IN FLUVANNA COUNTY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Fluvanna County:

(1) That The Code of the County of Fluvanna, Virginia is amended by enacting §§ 20-13-1 through 20-13-13, as follows:

CHAPTER 20 TAXATION

ARTICLE 13. – FOOD AND BEVERAGE TAX

Sec. 20-13-1. Definitions.

The words and phrases used in this article, shall have, for the purposes of this article, the meanings set forth in Virginia Code Sec. 58.1-3833, as the same may be amended from time to time.

Sec. 20-13-2. Levy of tax; amount.

In addition to all other taxes and fees of any kind now or hereafter imposed by law, a tax is hereby levied and imposed on the purchaser of all food and beverages served, sold or delivered for human consumption in the County in or from a restaurant, whether prepared in such restaurant or not, or prepared by a caterer. Grocery stores and convenience stores selling prepared foods ready for human consumption at a delicatessen counter shall be subject to the tax, for that portion of the grocery store or convenience store selling such items. The rate of this tax shall be percent of the amount paid for such food or beverage. In the computation of this tax, any fraction of one-half cent (\$0.005) or more shall be treated as one cent (\$0.01).

Sec. 20-13-3. Exemptions.

The tax levied under this article shall not apply to food and beverages served, sold or delivered which are declared to be exempt pursuant to Virginia Code Sec. 58.1-3833, subsections A. and C., as the same may be amended from time to time.

Sec. 20-13-4. Payment and collection of tax.

Every seller of food with respect to which a tax is levied under this article shall collect the amount of tax imposed under this article from the purchaser on whom the same is levied at the time payment for such food becomes due and payable, whether payment is to be made in cash or on credit by means of a credit card or otherwise. The amount of tax owed by the purchaser shall be added to the cost of the food and beverages by the seller who shall pay the taxes collected to the County as provided in this article. Taxes collected by the seller shall be held in trust by the seller until remitted to the County.

Sec. 20-13-5. Deduction for seller.

For the purpose of compensating sellers for the collection of the tax imposed by this article, every seller shall be allowed percent of the amount of the tax due and accounted for in the form

of a deduction on his monthly return not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per monthly return; provided, the full amount shall be due if any part of the payment is delinquent at the time of payment.

Sec. 20-13-6. Reports and remittances generally.

Every seller of food with respect to which a tax is levied under this article shall make out a report, upon such forms and setting forth such information as the Treasurer may prescribe and require, showing the amount of food charges collected and the tax required to be collected, and shall sign and deliver such report to the Treasurer with a remittance of such tax. It shall be presumed that all food served, sold or delivered in the County in or from a restaurant is taxable under this article and the burden shall be upon the seller of food to establish by records what food is not taxable. Such reports and remittance shall be made on or before the twentieth day of each month, covering the amount of tax collected during the preceding month.

Sec. 20-13-7. Preservation of records.

It shall be the duty of any seller of food liable for collection and remittance of the taxes imposed by this article to keep and preserve for a period of three (3) years records showing gross sales of all food and beverages, the amount charged the purchaser for each such purchase, the date thereof, the taxes collected thereon and the amount of tax required to be collected by this article. The Treasurer shall have the power to examine such records at reasonable times and without unreasonable interference with the business of the seller for the purpose of administering and enforcing the provisions of this article and to make copies of all or any parts thereof.

Sec. 20-13-8. Duty of seller when going out of business.

Whenever any seller required to collect or pay to the County a tax under this article shall cease to operate or otherwise dispose of his business, any tax payable under this article shall become immediately due and payable and such person shall immediately make a report and pay the tax due.

Sec. 20-13-9. Advertising payment or absorption of tax prohibited.

No seller shall advertise or hold out to the public in any manner, directly or indirectly, that all or any part of the tax imposed under this article will be paid or absorbed by the seller or anyone else, or that the seller or anyone else will relieve the purchaser of the payment of all or any part of the tax.

Sec. 20-13-10. Enforcement; duty of Treasurer.

The Treasurer shall have the power and the duty of collecting the taxes imposed and levied hereunder and shall cause the same to be paid into the general treasury for the County. It shall also be the duty of the Treasurer to ascertain the name of every seller liable for the collection of the tax imposed by this article who fails, refuses or neglects to collect such tax or to make the reports and remittances required by this article. The Treasurer shall have all of the enforcement powers as authorized by Article 2, Chapter 31 of Title 58.1 of the Code of Virginia for purposes of this article. In so acting, the Treasurer may promulgate reasonable rules and regulations for the interpretation, administration and enforcement of this article.

Sec. 20-13-11. Procedure upon failure to collect, report, etc.

If any seller whose duty it is to do so shall fail or refuse to collect the tax imposed under this article and to make, within the time provided in this article, the reports and remittances mentioned in this article, the Treasurer shall proceed in such manner as he may deem best to obtain facts and information on which to base his estimate of the tax due. As soon as the Treasurer shall procure such facts and information as he is able to obtain upon which to base the assessment of any tax payable by any seller who has failed or refused to collect such tax and to make such report and remittance, he shall proceed to determine and assess against such seller the tax and penalties provided for by this article and shall notify such seller, by registered mail sent to his last known place of address, of the total amount of such tax and penalties and the total amount thereof shall be payable within ten (10) days from the date such notice is sent.

Sec. 20-13-12. Penalty for late remittance or false return.

A. If any seller whose duty it is to do so shall fail or refuse to remit to the Treasurer the tax required to be collected and paid under this article within the time and in the amount specified in this article, there shall be added to such tax by the Treasurer a penalty in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the total amount of the tax owed if the failure is not for more than one month, with an additional penalty of five percent (5%) of the total amount of the tax owed for each additional month or fraction thereof during which the failure continues, such penalty not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the taxes collected but not remitted, provided, however, the minimum penalty shall be ten dollars (\$10.00), or the amount of the tax assessable, whichever is less.

B. If any seller whose duty it is to do so shall fail or refuse to file any return required by this article within the time specified in this article, there shall be added to such tax by the Treasurer a penalty in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the tax assessable on such return or \$10, whichever is greater; provided, however, that the penalty shall in no case exceed the amount of the tax assessable.

Sec. 20-13-13. Violations of article.

Any corporate or partnership officer as defined in Virginia Code § 58.1-3906, or any other person required to collect, account for and pay over tax under this article, who willfully fails to collect or truthfully account for and pay over such tax, and any person who willfully evades or attempts to evade any such tax or payment thereof, shall be punished in accordance with Sec. 1-10 of this Code. Conviction of such violation shall not relieve any person from the payment, collection or remittance of the taxes or penalties provided for in this article. Any agreement by any person to pay the taxes or penalties provided for in this article by a series of installment payments shall not relieve any person of criminal liability for violation of this article until the full amount of taxes and penalties agreed to be paid by such person is received by the Treasurer.

(2) That the Ordinance shall be effective on July 1, 2025.

GROUND SPACE LEASE

THIS DEED OF GROUND SPACE LEASE ("Lease") is made and entered into as of the _____ day of _____, 2025, in accordance with Virginia Code Section 15.2-1800, by and between the COUNTY OF FLUVANNA, a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Virginia, ("Lessor"), whose address is P.O. Box 540, Palmyra, Virginia 22963, and MONTICELLO AREA COMMUNITY ACTION AGENCY ("MACAA"), a not-for-profit corporation organized under the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, ("Lessee"), whose address is 1025 Park St. Charlottesville, VA 22901 The Lessor and Lessee are at times collectively referred to hereinafter as the "Parties" or individually as the "Party."

Now therefore, in consideration of the mutual promises, conditions, and other good and valuable consideration of the parties hereto, it is covenanted and agreed as follows:

- 1. Premises. Lessor is the owner of certain real property located in the County of Fluvanna, Virginia, hereinafter referred to as the "Premises," more particularly described as the basement level under the gymnasium at the Carysbrook Complex located at 8788 James Madison Highway, Fork Union VA 23055. The Premises shall include a non-exclusive right of ingress and egress from James Madison Highway to the Premises over the existing driveway or such other travelway(s) as Lessor may designate from time to time, and non-exclusive and reasonable use of the parking lot adjacent to the Premises
- **2. Demise of the Premises**. Lessor, in consideration of the terms, covenants, conditions and agreements set forth in this Lease, does hereby let and demise unto Lessee and Lessee does hereby take from the Lessor the Premises.
- **3. Title to Premises**. The Lessor represents and warrants to the Lessee that it has the power and authority to execute this Lease and to carry out and perform all covenants to be performed by the Lessor under this Lease.
- **4. Condition of Premises**. The Premises are vacant and undeveloped and are leased to the Lessee "as is" with all faults, without warranty or representation by Lessor as to condition or usefulness of the Premises for any purpose. The Lessee covenants and represents that it has inspected and is fully familiar with the condition of the Premises and accepts it "as is."
- 5. Use of Premises. Lessee shall use the Premises exclusively for the operation of a non-profit food pantry, a non-profit thrift store, and emergency assistance counselling services, together with such other programs as may be developed to assist Lessee with its mission of operating a non-profit food pantry, a thrift store, and providing emergency assistance counselling services. Lessee shall not commit or permit any waste or nuisance in or about the Premises and shall not do anything that might create an unreasonable fire hazard on the Premises. Lessee shall not violate any applicable law regarding the use of the Premises. No other use may be made of the Premises without the prior written consent of Lessor, which may be granted or withheld in Lessor's sole discretion. Lessee shall be solely responsible for obtaining any and all permits required for the construction and/or relocation of its improvements and conduct of its business.

- 6. Term; Renewal. This Lease begins at 12:01 A.M. on January 1, 2025 (the "Commencement Date"), and runs for a term of five (5) years until 12:00 A.M. on December 31, 2029 unless the Lease is terminated in accordance with the terms of this Lease. Thereafter, the Lease shall automatically be renewed for an additional five (5) year term unless either Party notifies the other that the Lease is not to be renewed, which notice must be given at least one hundred and twenty (120) days before the end of the term. The foregoing shall not be construed in any way to require either the Lessor or the Lessee to enter into such a renewal term or terms; and in no event shall this Lease be renewed if the Premises shall be required for any of the purposes provided in Virginia Code Section 15.2-1639.
- 7. Options to Terminate. Lessor and Lessee shall each have the right to terminate this Lease at any time, without cause, by giving not less than one hundred twenty (120) days written notice to the other Party.

In the event Lessor exercises the option to terminate set forth in this Section 10, Lessor shall pay Lessee an amount for the improvements to the Premises consistent with a straight line depreciation from the Commencement Date based upon the original construction/relocation cost of the improvements. Lessor shall have no other obligation to pay Lessee with respect to Lessee's improvements to the Premises.

8. Utilities; Site Maintenance

- (A) Lessee shall be solely responsible for and shall pay for all charges for telephone and any other communication or information service used, rendered or supplied upon or in connection with the Premises, including, but not limited to, the permits, connections charges, and installation of telephone and other communication service for its operations, and shall indemnify the Lessor against any and all liability or damages on such account. Lessee shall make reasonable use of any utilities used by it.
- (B) Lessee agrees to maintain any improvements constructed/relocated on the Premises in good repair.
- (C) In addition to the repairs referenced in subparagraph (B) above, Lessee agrees to keep the interior and exterior of the Premises in reasonably sanitary, neat and orderly condition, which shall include, without limitation, timely removal of accumulations of snow and ice, cleanup of trash and other debris and orderly storage of materials on the Premises itself. No materials, equipment or item of any kind shall be leaned against or otherwise stored in contact with the exterior walls of the building or be stored outside of the building.
- 9. Security; Access; Inspection. Lessee shall maintain the Premises in a reasonably secure condition and shall be solely responsible for the security of the Premises. Lessor shall have access to the Premises at all reasonable times during business hours for the purpose of inspecting the same for compliance with this Lease. Lessor and any responsible utility provider shall further have access to the exterior of the Premises for the purpose of installing, repairing, replacing and maintaining utility and/or service lines on or adjacent to the Premises at any time. Lessee shall provide Lessor with a list of individuals to contact in the event of an emergency on the Premises.

- 10. Taxes. Lessee shall pay any personal property, real estate, or other taxes, assessments, or charges levied against Lessee's leasehold, use of the Premises and/or the installation, maintenance, and operation of the Lessee's improvements.
- 11. Compliance with Laws. Lessee shall, at Lessee's sole cost and expense, comply with all federal, state, county or local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances now or hereafter enacted by any governmental authority or administrative agencies having jurisdiction over the Premises and Lessee's operations thereupon, including but not limited to obtaining any and all permits for construction of the improvements and operation of the Lessee's use.
- 12. Indemnification. Lessee shall indemnify and hold harmless Lessor against any claim of liability or loss from personal injury or property damage resulting from or arising out of the negligence or willful misconduct of Lessee, its employees, contractors, or agents, except to the extent such claims or damages may be due to or caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of Lessor, or its employees, contractors, or agents.
- 13. Insurance. Lessee agrees that at its own cost and expense, it shall continuously maintain general liability insurance insuring against liability for bodily injury, death or damage to personal property with combined single limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence. Lessee shall include Lessor as an additional insured and provide Lessor with a certificate evidencing such insurance prior to the commencement of this Lease, upon each renewal or change in the insurance, and otherwise upon request by Lessor. Nothing contained in this Lease shall be deemed to be a waiver of sovereign immunity by the Lessor. Lessee acknowledges that Lessor is not an insurer of Lessee's property and Lessee shall maintain such all-risk property insurance covering Lessee's fixtures, improvements, and personal property as Lessee deems appropriate for the protection of Lessee.
- 14. Default. If Lessor or Lessee fails to comply with any provisions of this Lease which the other Party claims to be a default hereof, the Party making such claim shall serve written notice of such default upon the defaulting Party and the defaulting Party shall be given thirty (30) days to cure such default. Said defaulting Party shall provide evidence that it is making a good faith effort to cure said default to the other Party upon request. Waiver of or failure to take any action with respect to any default shall not constitute a waiver of any subsequent or other default or the same or a different provision of this Lease.
- 15. Exclusive Venue; Attorney Fees and Expenses. In the event of any litigation arising under this Lease, the Parties agree that the exclusive venue therefor shall be in the courts located in the County of Fluvanna, and that the non-prevailing Party shall, upon demand, reimburse the substantially prevailing Party for all costs and expenses arising therefrom from time to time, including reasonable attorneys' fees.
- 16. Assignment; Sublease. Lessee shall not transfer or assign its rights under this Lease or let or sublet, in whole or in part, the Premises or any portion thereof, without the prior written consent of the Lessor, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld. No assignment or sublease shall relieve Lessee of any responsibilities under this Lease, unless Lessor specifically agrees to such release in writing.

- 17. Signs. With the prior written consent of Lessor, Lessee may place on the Premises appropriate signs for advertising the business or location of the non-profit food pantry, the thrift store, and the emergency assistance counselling services. All such signs must comply with all requirements of applicable laws, ordinances, and regulations. Lessee shall be solely responsible for obtaining any permits which may be required for any such sign. Upon the termination of this Lease, Lessee shall remove any sign erected or placed upon the Premises by Lessee, and Lessee shall repair any damage to the Premises caused by such attachment and/or removal.
- 18. Quiet Enjoyment. Subject to the terms of this Lease, Lessor covenants that the Lessee shall have quiet possession and enjoyment of the Premises throughout the Lease Term, as long as the Lessee is not in default hereunder.
- 19. Real Estate Agents. Lessor and Lessee warrant that they have had no dealing with any real estate broker or agent in connection with the negotiation of this Lease and that they know of no other real estate broker or agent who is or might be entitled to a commission in connection with this Lease. The Parties agree to assume responsibility for their own broker's fees, if any.
- **20. Surrender of Premises.** Upon the termination of this Lease, Lessee shall surrender the Premises promptly in accordance with the terms of this Lease. Any failure of Lessee to surrender the Premises shall be considered a holding over creating a tenancy at will with Lessee continuing to have all applicable responsibilities under this Lease.
- 21. Notices. Any notice, demand or communication required or permitted hereby shall be deemed to be sufficient if in writing and delivered by certified mail, return receipt requested, or in person or by commercial delivery service to the Parties, respectively, at the addresses set forth above. Any Party may substitute another address by giving a notice in the manner required. Any Party may also provide an email address or a facsimile number for the provision of any notice. Any notice given by mail shall be deemed to be received on the fifth (5th) business day after deposit postage prepaid in the United States mail, certified, return receipt requested. Any notice given by hand shall be deemed to be received when delivered. Notice by commercial delivery service, facsimile transmission or email shall be deemed to the method of delivery, provided that any notice delivered by facsimile transmission or email shall also be sent by United States first- class mail, postage prepaid.
- **22. Survival.** The provisions of this Lease relating to indemnification by the Lessee shall survive any termination or expiration of this Lease. Additionally, any provisions of this Lease which require or contemplate performance subsequent to the termination or expiration of this Lease shall also survive such termination or expiration.
- **23. General Provisions.** This Lease contains the final and entire agreement between the parties hereto, superseding any and all prior agreements, representations or other matters preexisting between the parties regarding the subject matter hereof.

As appropriate to the context, the masculine shall include the feminine and neutral genders and vice versa, and the singular shall include the plural and vice versa. The headings contained in this Lease

Requested Action: Approval of amendments to the Fluvanna County Zoning Ordinance

by amending §§15-4-1 and 22-26-7 to clarify the requirements of

the phrase "shielded and screened from view."

Background Information: A public hearing was held on December 18, 2024 by the Board of

Supervisors to consider this ordinance amendment. The Board took no action with regard to the amendment and directed staff to prepare an amendment that included requirements more restrictive

than what staff presented at the December 18, 2024 meeting.

These amendments clarify that the requirement that inoperable vehicles be "shielded or screened from view" can be met by 1. placing the vehicle within a fully enclosed building or structure, 2. placing the vehicle within an area completely enclosed either by a solid, rigid, opaque fence composed of standard fencing materials or by a landscaped arrangement of nondeciduous trees, sufficient in height, spacing, density and circumference to eliminate visibility of the vehicle, or 3. covering the vehicle with a fitted vehicle

cover.

Recommended Motion:

ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND REORDAIN "THE CODE OF THE COUNTY OF FLUVANNA, VIRGINIA" BY AMENDING §§ 15-4-1 AND 22-26-7 TO CLARIFY THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE PHRASE "SHIELDED AND SCREENED FROM VIEW"

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Fluvanna County:

(1) That the Code of the County of Fluvanna, Virginia is amended by amending § 15-4-1 and 22-26-7as follows:

CHAPTER 15 MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

ARTICLE 4. – INOPERABLE VEHICLES

Sec. 15-4-1. – Restriction of keeping of inoperable vehicles, etc.; removal; penalty.

- (A) Definitions.
- (1) As used in this section, the term *farm use* shall have the meaning ascribed to it in section 46.2-698(B) of the Code of Virginia.
- (2) As used in this section, the term *inoperable* shall apply to: (i) any vehicle which is not in operating condition; (ii) any vehicle which for a period of 90 days or longer has been partially or totally disassembled by the removal of tires and wheels, the engine, or other essential parts required for operation of the vehicle; or (iii) any vehicle on which there are displayed neither valid license plates nor a valid inspection decal. Farm use vehicles shall not be considered "inoperable" solely for failure to display valid license plates and a valid inspection decal.
- (3) As used in this section, *shielded or screened from view* means not visible completely precluding visibility of the subject vehicle by someone standing at ground level from outside of the property on which the subject vehicle is located by (i) placing the vehicle within a fully enclosed building or structure, (ii) placing the vehicle within an area completely enclosed either by a solid, rigid, opaque fence composed of standard fencing materials or by a landscaped arrangement of nondeciduous trees, sufficient in height, spacing, density and circumference to eliminate visibility of the vehicle, or (iii) covering the vehicle with a fitted vehicle cover.
- (4) As used in this section, *vehicle* means a motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer, as each is defined in section 46.2-100 of the Code of Virginia.
- (B) It shall be unlawful for any person to keep any inoperable vehicle on any property zoned for residential or agricultural purposes except:
- (1) In all zoning districts, such inoperable vehicle(s) may be kept within a fully enclosed building or structure; and
- (2) In areas zoned residential, a maximum of two such inoperable vehicles to be restored may be kept if they are shielded or screened from view; and

- (3) In areas zoned agricultural, a maximum of five such inoperable vehicles may be kept if they are shielded or screened from view.
- (C) The owners of property zoned for residential or agricultural purposes shall remove therefrom any such inoperable vehicles that are kept in violation of this section within 30 days of receipt of written notice thereof from the County. If a property owner fails to comply with this subsection, the County, through its own agents or employees may remove any such inoperable vehicles. In the event the County, through its own agents or employees, removes any such inoperable vehicle pursuant to this subsection, the County may dispose of such inoperable vehicle no sooner than 15 days after giving written notice to the owner of the inoperable vehicle.
- (D) The cost of the removal and disposal described in subsection (c) above shall be chargeable to the owner of the inoperable vehicles or premises and may be collected by the County as taxes are collected. Every cost authorized by this section with which the owner of the premises has been assessed shall constitute a lien against the property from which the inoperable vehicle was removed, the lien to continue until actual payment of such costs has been made to the County.
- (E) Notwithstanding the other provisions of this section, if the owner of such inoperable vehicle can demonstrate that he is actively restoring or repairing the inoperable vehicle, and if it is shielded or screened from view, the inoperable vehicle and one additional inoperative vehicle that is shielded or screened from view and being used for the restoration or repair may remain on the property.
- (F) Violations of this section shall be punishable as a Class 1 misdemeanor.
- (G) The provisions of this section shall not apply to a licensed business which on June 26, 1970, was regularly engaged in business as an automobile dealer, salvage dealer or scrap processor.

CHAPTER 22 ZONING

ARTICLE 26. – OFF-STREET PARKING AND LOADING SPACES

Sec. 22-26-7. - Interpretations of off-street parking and loading requirements.

- (A) The off-street parking and loading requirements are in addition to space for the storage of trucks or other vehicles used in connection with any use.
- (B) The off-street parking and loading requirements do not limit special requirements that may be imposed in the case of planned unit developments, conditional uses, or special exceptions.
- (C) Where fractional spaces result, the parking spaces and loading spaces required shall be construed to be the next highest whole number.
- (D) No inoperable vehicle shall be parked or stored on a lot in any zoning district unless the vehicle is within a fully enclosed building or structure, or are otherwise shielded or screened from view from all public roads and adjoining properties. "Shielded or screened from view" means completely precluding visibility of the subject vehicle by someone standing at

ground level from outside of the property on which the subject vehicle is located by (i) placing the vehicle within a fully enclosed building or structure, (ii) placing the vehicle within an area completely enclosed either by a solid, rigid, opaque fence composed of standard fencing materials or by a landscaped arrangement of nondeciduous trees, sufficient in height, spacing, density and circumference to eliminate visibility of the vehicle, or (iii) covering the vehicle with a fitted vehicle cover.

(2) That the Ordinance shall be effective upon adoption.

7 – PRESENTATIONS

Economic Development Strategic Plan Update – Jennifer Schmack, Director of Economic Development <u>Background</u>

- July 2021 the County approved a contract with Platinum PR to facilitate the creation of an Economic Development Strategic Plan.
- January 2022 Platinum PR held individual interviews with members of the Board of Supervisors and the Economic Development Authority. In addition, three focus group sessions were conducted: one group comprised of staff and two groups of community stakeholders. Data collected from these meetings was used to draft the proposed Strategic Goals.
- April 2022 Platinum PR presented the proposed Economic Development Strategic Goals to the Board of Supervisors. Feedback from this discussion was used to prepare the draft strategic plan.
- August 2022 the Board of Supervisors reviewed and discussed the draft Economic Development Strategic Plan at their planning retreat.
- September 2022 Fluvanna's first Economic Development Strategic Plan was adopted by the Board of Supervisors.

Fluvanna Forward

- Fluvanna County's Economic Development Strategic Plan reflects the county's commitment to fostering a vibrant, business-friendly environment that drives growth and opportunity. Guided by four strategic goals, the county has made significant strides in streamlining the business process, supporting entrepreneurship, enhancing tourism, and addressing workforce challenges.
- These achievements underscore a collaborative approach to economic development, leveraging partnerships, community engagement, and innovative initiatives to positioning Fluvanna County as a business and tourism destination.

Goal 1:

Position Fluvanna County as a business-friendly county with competitive assets in the Central Virginia region. Goal 2:

Foster entrepreneurship, business growth, and expansion in Fluvanna County through business retention efforts.

Goal 3:

Develop new and enhance existing tourism experiences, activities, and events in Fluvanna County to increase tourism attraction.

Goal 4:

Support Fluvanna County businesses with talent recruitment and retention challenges.

Looking Forward

Building on these successes, the Economic Development Office remains focused on sustaining momentum and exploring new opportunities for growth.

With Fluvanna County continuing to invest in infrastructure, expand support for local businesses, and enhance the county's tourism profile, the strategic plan aims to ensure long-term economic vibrancy.

County Food and Beverage Tax (Meals Tax) - Eric Dahl, County Administrator

Local taxing authority was passed by the General Assembly that allows Counties to now implement a meals tax without a referendum, effective July 1, 2020. The Board considered the option of implementing a meals tax in our County and put the referendum question to the voters in November 2018, but it failed to pass. The legislation from 2020 includes that a County may not impose a meals tax until six years after a referendum failed. With this language, Fluvanna was prohibited from adopting a meals tax ordinance until November 2024. A conservative estimate shows that a meal tax could generate \$300-\$600K annually, which equates to 1-2 cents of real estate tax. The board is eligible to implement the tax now that six years has passed.

OUTLINE OF COUNTY FOOD AND BEVERAGE TAX AUTHORITY

- 1. County is authorized to levy tax on food and beverages sold, for human consumption, by a "restaurant" as defined in Virginia Code Sec. 35.1-1 (see below for both enabling statutes).
- 2. Maximum rate of tax is 6%.
- 3. Applies to alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages served as part of a meal, but does not apply to gratuities.
- 4. Despite the breadth of the definition of "restaurant" there are numerous exemptions, such as "in-house" cafeterias, etc., for employees only; non-profit fundraisers; churches and schools; hospitals, etc., for patients, et al.; day care centers; publicly-owned facilities.
- 5. Scope of tax coverage includes food stores serving ready-to-eat foods.
- 6. Collection procedures established by local ordinance.

Virginia Code Sec. 58.1-3833 authorizes any county in Virginia to adopt a tax on certain food and beverages (sometimes called a "meals tax"). Such tax cannot exceed 6% of the price of the price of the products and applies to food and beverages (including alcoholic beverages) served by a restaurant, as defined in Virginia Code Sec. 35.1-1. The definition of "restaurant" is subject to many exceptions set forth in the enabling statute.

^{*}Towns and cities whose charters grant them taxing powers pursuant to or consistent with those described in Va. Code § 15.2-1104 are authorized to impose a meals tax under Va. Code § 58.1-3840 and are not subject to the limitations imposed on counties by Va. Code § 58.1-3833 (1992 Op. Va. Atty Gen. 168).

8 - ACTION MATTERS

Zion Crossroads West Waterline Funding – Eric Dahl, County Administrator

In February 2020, the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) approached the County about extending the Zion Crossroads waterline on U.S. Route 250 1.1 miles west of where it currently terminates on Memory Lane, to properties contaminated by an old petroleum release. Four petroleum impacted properties currently have water treatment systems until a permanent solution is provided. In addition, two nearby properties are at risk of petroleum contamination. This project extension helps to provide a long-term water source to the affected residents of the County, eliminating the need for the water treatment systems and advances a future phase of the Zion Crossroads project earlier with the assistance of DEQ.

The County has funding agreements with DEQ; the first is for Engineering Services, were DEQ will fund up to \$200,000, and the second is for Construction Services, were DEQ will fund up to \$800,000 and/or excess of remaining Engineering funds.

The board approved a project agreement with Dewberry Engineers for \$149,769 which includes, but is not limited to, preliminary design; subsurface utility engineer; surveying; geotechnical engineering; environmental

investigation and permitting; PRV design; final design. The final design is substantially complete, with some slight design modifications still needed.

The Board of Supervisors have deferred moving forward with the project for the last couple of fiscal years in anticipation of a possible grant to fund the project, which has not materialized.

 - a. There is no Build America/Buy America and Davis Bacon requirements, slightly lower costs, 4.15% current interest rate for 20 years with an annual estimated debt service payment of \$135,166
- 3. Reject the BIL loan and fund with Unassigned fund balance
 - a. There is no Build America/Buy America and Davis Bacon requirements, slightly lower costs, no debt service principal and interest payment, reducing unassigned fund balance and a reduction in interest income over 20 years.

Confirmation of Local Emergency Declaration – Eric Dahl, County Administrator

Beginning Sunday, January 5, 2025, Fluvanna County Public Safety and Emergency Management Staff determined that the threat of potential injury from Winter Storm Blair, forecast to impact Central Virginia, was great enough to warrant coordinated local government action to prevent or alleviate any potential damage, loss, hardship, or suffering. A Declaration of Local Emergency grants Fluvanna County access to state and federal resources in order to address any public safety needs that may arise as a result of the anticipated storm and its residual effects.

Governor Glenn Youngkin declared a State of Emergency on Friday, January 3, 2025.

This action is consistent with the requirements of the Code of Virginia Emergency Services and Disaster Law.

Code of Virginia § 44-146.21. Declaration of local emergency.

(a) A local emergency may be declared by the local director of emergency management with the consent of the governing body of the political subdivision. In the event the governing body cannot convene due to the disaster or other exigent circumstances, the director, or in his absence, the deputy director, or in the absence of both the

director and deputy director, any member of the governing body may declare the existence of a local emergency, subject to confirmation by the governing body at its next regularly scheduled meeting or at a special meeting within fourteen days of the declaration, whichever occurs first. The governing body, when in its judgment all emergency actions have been taken, shall take appropriate action to end the declared emergency.

PROJECT AGREEMENT # 02 TERM CONTRACT BETWEEN COUNTY AND ARCHITECT/ENGINEER FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

Fluvanna County Historic Courthouse

This Project Agreement #02 (the Project Agreement") made this ___day of _________, 2025 between Fluvanna County, Virginia (the "County"), a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Virginia, and MTFA Architecture, PLLC ("A/E"), a Virginia limited liability company, is an addendum to that TERM CONTRACT BETWEEN COUNTY AND ARCHITECT/ENGINEER FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES dated the 23rd day of February, 2024 (including all exhibits, and as modified by any amendments or addenda thereto the "Agreement"). All defined terms in the Agreement shall have the same meaning in this Project Agreement unless the context used herein requires otherwise.

Whereas, pursuant to the Agreement the County shall issue written task orders to the A/E as services are needed;

Whereas, the A/E submitted a proposal letter dated January 8, 2025 entitled "Fluvanna County Historic Courthouse, Courthouse Order 02 – Phase 2 Restoration" (the "Proposal") which is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and made a material part hereof;

Whereas, the County desires that the Consultant complete the work and services set forth in the Proposal, including, without limitation, the services described both in the "Base Scope of Work" section and the "Optional Scopes of Work – Option A" section, which services are generally described therein as:

• The purpose of this task order ("Task Order") will be to implement the exterior envelope and life safety recommendations of Phase 1 Investigations and 2022 Historic Structure Report (Base Scope of Work), and the interior recommendations of the same (Option A).

Now therefore, for good and valuable consideration, the parties hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE I: THE AGREEMENT

The foregoing recitations are incorporated by reference into this Project Agreement.

This Project Agreement is an addendum to and made a material part of the Agreement. The parties hereto agree that except as specifically and expressly modified hereby that Agreement remains in full force and effect and the provisions of the Agreement are incorporated herein and are a material part hereof.

ARTICLE II: TASK ORDER

Consultant shall provide all work and services as needed and necessary or desired to complete Services on the Task Order consistent with all provisions of this Project Agreement, the Proposal, and the Agreement.

ARTICLE III: EXHIBITS AND RESOLVING CONFLICTS

The rights and duties of the County and Consultant applicable to the County's projects under this Project Agreement are set forth in the following Agreement Documents:

- i. This Project Agreement;
- ii. Exhibit 1 hereto;
- iii. Exhibit 2 hereto, being the Term Contract for Professional Services dated February 23, 2024 and including exhibits thereto; and
- iv. Exhibit 3 hereto, being the County of Fluvanna General Terms Conditions and Instructions to Bidders and Contractors

Whenever possible, the terms of the above Agreement Documents shall be read together, however in the event of a conflict, the order of preference above shall govern which Document will control. In other words, (i) shall control over (ii) to (iv) above, and (ii) shall control over (iii) and (iv) and so forth.

ARTICLE IV: FEES

The A/E shall receive up to a not-to-exceed total of TWO HUNDRED EIGHTY-NINE THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED FIFTY AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$289,350.00) based on actual time worked, which shall be payable by the County MONTHLY based on actual time worked upon Final Completion of the Services.

The flat fee is a not-to exceed amount. The hourly fees up to the not-to-exceed total per task shall be payable by the County upon proper invoice by the A/E as described herein. The A/E shall submit invoices to the County monthly for services actually rendered on each subtask and upon final completion. The invoice shall describe the services rendered to date with specificity. The A/E will be paid within forty-five (45) days of receipt of a valid invoice following final acceptance of all work by the County in the County's sole discretion ("Final Completion"). No invoice may be provided by the A/E to the County until the items or services purchased have been delivered to, inspected by and accepted by the County. In no event shall the fees invoiced or due under this Project Agreement exceed \$289,350.00 total.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Proposal, the A/E shall be paid the lower of the hourly rate for the title/type of person actually performing the work set forth in the Proposal hereto or the hourly rate set forth in **Exhibit 2** to this Agreement, up to the not-to-exceed fees for the Task Order Services set forth in this Project Agreement. The County shall be billed for increments of an hour based on A/E's standard procedure except as otherwise required by the Agreement.

The fee includes all fees, costs and charges of any kind to perform all the services and work, including supplying at its own cost and expense any necessary tools, equipment or materials necessary or desirable for completion of the task(s) specified.

ARTICLE V: TERM

A/E shall with due diligence and dispatch assiduously pursue this Task Order to completion. In any event such Services and work on this Task Order necessary to advance to commencement of construction

must be completed to the sole satisfaction of the County no later than nine (9) months from the date the County executes this Project Agreement, time being of the essence.

ARTICLE VI: MISCELLANEOUS

As appropriate to the context, the singular will include the plural and vice versa, and reference to one gender will include the others. This Project Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which will be considered the Project Agreement for all purposes of proof. In addition to allowing electronic signatures upon an electronic copy of this Project Agreement, as provided by Virginia law, facsimile signatures upon any signature page will be considered to be original signatures. This Project Agreement contains the entire understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and is to be modified only by a writing signed by the parties to this Project Agreement. This Project Agreement will be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the respective parties and their successors. This Project Agreement is not assignable by either party, except by operation of law. We are pleased to submit a fee proposal for Courthouse Order 02 – Exterior Restoration under the Term Contract dated February 23, 2024 for the Fluvanna County (FC) Historic Courthouse AE Services in Palmyra, Virginia. This purchase order pursues the Phase 1 recommendations as well as the recommendations included in the Historic Structure Report (HSR) dated September 7, 2022 for the exterior envelope and other upgrades for life safety and systems. All subsequent phases of AE services are to be handled as separate purchase orders. Our lump sum fee is based on the scope of services with exclusions noted below and assumes, based on preliminary cost estimating, a project budget of \$1.4 million for the Exterior scope of work and \$1.1 million for the Interior scope of work.

- o (1) hybrid design development review meeting with FC.

<u>OPTION B</u> – This option will include the preparation of hand-painted watercolor renderings of the proposed restoration design. Three renderings measuring 16" x 20" will be completed. MTFA proposes one exterior view from the front and two interior views, one facing north and another facing south. The hardcopy renderings will be issued along with digital versions for use in fundraising and marketing the project. Renderings require approximately 20-24 hours per painting to complete, depending on the particular view.

CLARIFICATIONS AND ASSUMPTIONS

The following are clarifications and assumptions related to the scope of work and our proposal:

- A. <u>Standards</u>: Our work will be in accordance with the Secretary of the Interior's Standard for the Treatment of Historic Properties, 2021 Virginia Construction Code, 2021 Virginia Existing Building Code, 2009 ICC/ANSI A117.1, and any applicable standards/requirements from Fluvanna County.
- B. <u>Schedule:</u> A proposed schedule is attached to this proposal. MTFA will endeavor to meet project deadlines, but MTFA cannot guarantee the performance of others.
- C. <u>Project Phasing</u>: It is MTFA's understanding that the interior work will be considered separately and it is assumed that the work could occur either in concert with the Exterior or on a separate timeline from the Exterior work. The former is preferred from an A/E design perspective as it allows for a holistic consideration of the building.
- D. <u>Site assessment requirements:</u> Costs for any equipment rental and operation needed for supplemental site survey are excluded from the fee estimate provided. Necessity for any additional survey efforts will be reviewed with FC during project. All other field verification work will occur from grade or via ladders.
- E. <u>Meetings</u>: Four (4) design meetings are identified on the schedule: 1) Kick-Off Meeting remote; 2) Site Coordination Meeting in-person; 3) 30% DD Review Meeting MTFA in-person, all other A/E members remote; 4) 95% CD Review Meeting MTFA in-person, all other A/E members remote. Any further meetings will be considered additional services.
 - Additional in-person attendance at pre-bid meeting and eight (8) in-person construction progress meetings by MTFA and Train each are included.
- F. <u>Specifications:</u> MTFA will prepare division 01 for general requirements in collaboration with FC. MTFA and its consultants will prepare all applicable technical specifications for sections for the project, including Masterspec divisions 02 through 28. FC is to prepare procurement and contracting requirements, also known as division 00.
- G. <u>Unforeseen conditions:</u> Due to the limited visual accessibility of the existing structure, there may be existing conditions that will not be discovered during the investigation phase. These unknown conditions may result in changes that require redesign work and a possible increase in construction

cost. Any redesign work required due to the presence of hidden and unknown existing field conditions will be considered an additional service.

- H. <u>Utility Information</u>: FC shall provide utility information and requirements from local suppliers.
- I. <u>Submissions and printing</u>: With one exception, all submissions are to be digital. For any requested printing costs requested by AHS, the cost of the reimbursable times 1.15 shall be expensed to AHS to accommodate the administrative costs. If approved, the renderings proposed as optional services are the exception to this digital approach, as for this effort both digital and hard copy original versions will be provided.
- J. <u>Historic Review Processes</u>: Based on receipt of a state grant, it is expected that the work will be subject to state historic review approval. MTFA has included time to manage milestone submissions and coordinate review responses with the Virginia Department of Historic Resources.
- K. Excluded services: Per the scope of work the following services are excluded from Phase 1:
 - 1. Any scope of work not explicitly included.
 - 2. Meetings beyond those indicated above.
 - 3. Destructive demolition and repairs.

 - 7. Site lighting beyond immediate perimeter of building.
 - 8. Life Cycle Cost Analysis of the HVAC system.
 - 9. LEED or other sustainable design certification documentation.
 - 10. Utility design and testing, such as electric metering and fire flow testing.
 - 11. Civil engineering and survey.
 - 12. Landscape architecture.
 - 13. Permitting fees.

I. SCOPE OF WORK

Berkley Group will provide Interim Director of Emergency Services to the Fluvanna County, VA. Mr. Steve Morris, Executive Manager, will be the individual assigned to provide these services.

The following assumptions shall apply:

- 1. **Appointments:** This scope of work assumes that the County will accommodate occasional medical and other personal appointments, as needed.
- 2. **Insurance:** Berkley Group will be additionally insured under current policy given the nature of the work and responsibilities.
- 3. **Director of Emergency Management:** Berkley Group and its employees are not appointed as the Director of Emergency Management pursuant to Virginia Code Section 44-146.19.
- 4. **Legal:** In accordance with the contract, the County shall defend the Berkley Group and its respective staff in any legal proceedings by a third party arising out of the performance of duties on behalf of the County.

II. SCHEDULE

Beginning no earlier than January 16, 2025, Mr. Morris will be available to provide up to 32 hours per week of on-site and off-site support, as needed.

III. FEES

The fee for Interim Director of Emergency Services is \$150 per hour. If additional hours are desired, they may be provided by mutual agreement by both parties at \$150/per hour. The Berkley Group reserves the right to terminate this work order after a period of 180 days in the event that the position is unfilled or may extend it upon mutual agreement by both parties. A County vehicle will be made available to the Interim Director of Emergency Services. The County will provide a vehicle for commuting to and from Mr. Morris's residence. If a County vehicle is unavailable, the County will provide mileage reimbursement at the prevailing IRS rate. Any lodging will be reimbursed at cost. These services will be invoiced twice monthly.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN BERKLEY GROUP, LLC AND FLUVANNA COUNTY, VIRGINIA FOR ON CALL CONSULTING SERVICES

This Agreement entered into on this ____ day of ______, 20__ by and between Berkley Group, LLC, a limited liability company organized under the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, having offices at P.O. Box 181, Bridgewater, Virginia 22812 (Federal EIN # 273021021), and hereafter called "Berkley Group", and Fluvanna County, a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Virginia, having its administrative office at 132 Main Street, Palmyra, VA 22963, and hereafter called "the Client".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Client desires to retain the services of the Berkley Group to perform on call consulting services, and

WHEREAS, Berkley Group desires to provide the Client with such services as authorized by the Client, and represents that it is organized and authorized to conduct business within the Commonwealth of Virginia;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Virginia Code Section 2.2-4304, Cooperative procurement, Any public body may participate in, sponsor, conduct, or administer a cooperative procurement agreement on behalf of or in conjunction with one or more other public bodies, or public agencies or institutions or localities of the several states, of the United States or its territories, the District of Columbia, or the U.S. General Services Administration, for the purpose of combining requirements to increase efficiency or reduce administrative expenses in any acquisition of goods and services. A public body may purchase from another public body's contract even if it did not participate in the request for proposal or invitation to bid, if the request for proposal or invitation to bid specified that the procurement was being conducted on behalf of other public bodies;

WHEREAS, the GEORGE WASHINGTON REGIONAL COMMISSION issued a request for proposals as a cooperative procurement for other public bodies for nonprofessional services, for which Berkley Group was awarded the contract;

WHEREAS, the Client desires to participate in said cooperative procurement agreement to obtain certain on call consulting services; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties do mutually agree as follows:

SECTION 1. STATEMENT/SCOPE OF WORK.

- A. Berkley Group will provide services to Client once issued individual Work Orders for each task assigned constituting the Scope of Services ("Scope of Services") as set forth in this Agreement.
- B. Berkley Group will use both its staff and independent contractors it engages (the "Subcontractors") to provide the Services to Client.

C. Berkley Group and its Subcontractors are and shall remain independent contractors with respect to the Client in their provision of the Services under this Agreement.

SECTION 2. COMPENSATION, METHOD OF PAYMENT, TIME OF PERFORMANCE AND TERMINATION.

- A. **Compensation**. Client shall compensate Berkley Group for the Services performed based upon the terms described within the Fee Schedule plus an indirect cost rate for overhead as specified in each task order ("Compensation"). For interim staff assignments, the parties agree to increase the Compensation by three percent (3%) per cent on an annual basis to coincide with the Client's fiscal year.
- B. **Payment to the Berkley Group**. Client shall pay Berkley Group for the Services performed as set forth in the payment schedule for each Work Order. All invoices shall be due within thirty (30) days of the invoice date. Payments later than sixty (60) days shall be subject to a fifteen percent (15%) late charge fee.
- C. **Time of Performance.** Berkley Group shall commence performance of the Services on and shall continue such performance through _____ ("Term"). The Term shall automatically renew each year for up to five (5) years and may thereafter be extended for additional periods by written agreement of the parties pursuant to Section 6 of this Agreement but shall remain subject to termination for non-appropriation of funding.
- D. **Termination for Convenience.** Either the Client or Berkley Group may terminate this Agreement at any time, by giving written notice to the other party of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof, at least 30 days before such effective date.
 - (1) In the event of termination, all finished and unfinished documents and other materials produced by Berkley Group specifically for the Client shall become the property of the Client.
 - (2) In the event of termination, Berkley Group shall be paid for the Services performed up to the effective date of termination. For any incomplete services, the Client will provide Berkley Group with compensation equivalent to 80% of the total executed Work Order value for the assigned task. Upon request, the Berkley Group will provide the Client with documentation of the Services performed up to the effective date of termination.
 - (3) Termination for non-appropriation of funds by the Client shall be made pursuant to this section.
- E. **Termination for Breach.** The Client or Berkley Group may terminate this Agreement for a material breach of the terms of this Agreement by giving written notice to the other party of such termination specifying the effective date thereof, at least 15 days before such effective date. The notice shall set forth the nature of the breach of the Agreement.
 - (1) In the event of termination of this Agreement by the Client pursuant to this Section 2.E., Berkley Group shall be paid for Services performed up to the

- D. The Client agrees not to hire staff of Berkley Group as Client's own employee during the Term of this Agreement, and for six (6) months following termination of this Agreement.

SECTION 5. ADMINISTRATION OF THE AGREEMENT.

A. All notices and communications with respect to the terms of this Agreement and the performance of the Services shall be through the Party Representatives. The Party Representatives are:

- B. **Incorporated Provisions.** This Agreement shall be performed in accordance with the applicable, required contractual provisions set forth in the Client's purchasing or procurement regulations in effect at the time of this Agreement, including the Virginia Public Procurement Act, Va. Code §§ 2.2-4300, et seq., ; Va. Code § 2.2-4310 and 4311 (nondiscrimination); Va. Code § 2.2-4311.1 (immigration); and Va. Code § 2.2-4312 (drug free workplace), which provisions are incorporated herein by reference.
- C. **Contractual.** Disputes with respect to this Agreement shall be governed by Va. Code § 2.2-4363 and all similar provisions in Client's purchasing or procurement regulations.
- D. Ownership and Status of Documents.
 - All documents prepared by Berkley Group specifically for the Client shall become the property of the Client upon completion of Services, or the earlier termination of this Agreement. Berkley Group shall have the right to retain appropriate copies of all such documents for its records upon client's approval, and to reuse any template documents which it prepared for the Client. All materials, including without limitation, documents, drawings, drafts, notes, designs, computer media, electronic files and lists, including all additions to, deletions from, alterations of, and revisions in the foregoing (collectively referred to as the "Materials"), which are furnished to Berkley Group by Client or which are developed in the process of performing the Services, or embody or relate to the Services, are the property of Client, and shall be returned by Berkley Group to Client promptly

- A. Berkley Group agrees to use the records and information gathered or otherwise used pursuant to this Agreement for the advancement of the interests of Client, and as further provided in Section 5.D. of this Agreement.
- B. Berkley Group will provide all services under this Agreement in a manner consistent with applicable laws, professional standards and its best efforts.
- C. Berkley Group, its staff and Subcontractors shall comply with Client's standards for acceptable workplace conduct and safety, and shall at all times conduct themselves in a professional manner.
- D. Berkley Group and its Subcontractors shall maintain commercial general liability insurance to cover their actions or omissions. Upon request, shall provide the Client with evidence of such insurance.
- E. Berkley Group shall perform in accordance with, and shall not violate, applicable laws, rules or regulations, and standards prevailing in the industry and the Berkley Group shall obtain all permits or permissions required to comply with such laws, rules or regulations.

SECTION 4. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CLIENT.

- A. Without charge to Berkley Group, Client agrees to provide all policies, information, communications, records, data, information and forms which are available to the Client and needed by Berkley Group in order to perform the Services, and not to include any confidential files or documents subject to confidentiality laws.

- B. The parties hereto may, from time to time, propose changes in the attached Scope of services or in Berkley Group's performance requirements. Such changes must be mutually agreed upon by the parties in writing and signed by the authorized representatives of both parties.

SECTION 7. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

- A. Protection of Confidential Information. Berkley Group agrees that at all times during or subsequent to the performance of the Services, Berkley Group will keep confidential and not divulge, communicate, or use Client's Information, except for the Berkley Group's own use during the Term of this Agreement to the extent necessary to perform the Services. Berkley Group further agrees not to cause the transmission, removal or transport of tangible embodiments of, or electronic files containing, Client's Information from Client's principal place of business, without prior written approval of Client.
- B. Hold Harmless. Berkley Group hereby indemnifies and holds harmless the Client, its subsidiaries, and affiliates, and their officers and employees, from any damages, claims, liabilities, and costs, including reasonable attorney's fees, or losses, provided that such damages, claims, liabilities, costs, including reasonable attorney's fees, or losses, must be attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease or death, or injury to or destruction of tangible property which may in any way arise from the negligent acts, errors, or omissions of Berkley Group and its Subcontractors, and which arise out of Berkley Group's performance of its professional services under this Agreement, or any breach or alleged breach by Berkley Group of this Agreement, including the warranties set forth herein ("Loss"). Berkley Group's indemnification obligations under this clause shall not extend to claims or liabilities arising from the Client's negligence, gross

negligence, willful misconduct, or breach of this Agreement. The parties agree that Berkley Group's indemnification obligations shall not exceed the monetary amount paid by the Client for Berkley Group's services rendered. The parties further agree that Berkley Group's obligation to indemnify any Loss under this Agreement shall not arise until liability for such Loss has been determined by a court of competent jurisdiction, or by mutual agreement of the parties. The obligations and rights of indemnification under this clause shall survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

- C. <u>Taxes.</u> The Client shall not be liable for taxes, Worker's Compensation, unemployment insurance, employers' liability, employer's FICA, social security, withholding tax, or other taxes or withholding for or on behalf of Berkley Group or any other person consulted or employed by Berkley Group in performing Services under this Agreement. All such costs shall be Berkley Group's responsibility.
- D. <u>Jurisdiction and Venue</u>. This Agreement shall be construed pursuant to the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia without regard to conflict of laws provisions. The parties agree to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction and venue of the Circuit Court of the County of Rockingham, Virginia, or the United States District Court, Western District, Harrisonburg Division, over any action, suit, or proceeding arising out of or relating to this Agreement, and the parties irrevocably submit to the jurisdiction of such courts for any such action, suit, or proceeding. Severability. The provisions of this Agreement are severable, and if any one or more provisions may be determined to be illegal or otherwise unenforceable, in whole or in part, the remaining provisions and any partially unenforceable provisions to the extent enforceable shall nevertheless be binding and enforceable.
- E. Waiver. Any waiver of a default under this Agreement must be made in writing signed by the waiving Party and shall not be a waiver of any other default concerning the same or any other provision of this Agreement. No delay or omission in the exercise of any right or remedy shall impair such right or remedy or be constructed as a waiver. A consent to or approval of any act shall not be deemed to waive or render unnecessary consent to or approval of any other or subsequent act.
- F. Successors and Assigns. To the extent permitted by state law, Berkley Group may assign this Agreement to any subsidiary or corporate affiliate, or to any successor or assign (whether direct or indirect, by purchase, merger, consolidation, or otherwise) to all or substantially all of the business or assets of Employer. The Client may not assign this Agreement or any part hereof without the prior written consent of Berkley Group. Any purported assignment by the Client shall be null and void from the initial date of such purported assignment.
- G. <u>Attorney's Fees</u>. In the event any party initiates any proceedings to enforce the terms of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to an award of its reasonable attorney's fees and costs.
- H. Headings: Recitals. Headings of the sections and paragraphs of this Agreement are intended solely for convenience of the parties, and no provision of this Agreement is

to be construed by reference to the caption or heading of any section or paragraph. The recitals of this Agreement are hereby incorporated into this Agreement as if restated herein.

I. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
